- Only use the bed and locker assigned at check-in. Items in the wrong locker or on the wrong bed will be removed and you may be charged for the use of a second bed/locker.
- Quiet hours are from 11:00pm to 7:00am. Please take your conversations to the public areas on the 1st and 2nd floor.
- Check out is 11:00am. After 11:00am we may have to cut your lock and assess a \$25 late check out fee.
- The kitchen, TV room, laundry, library, and game room are located on the 2nd floor.
- We sell padlocks for \$5 at the front desk. After checkout, luggage can be stored at the front desk for \$3 per bag until 1AM ONLY. Any luggage left after that time will be discarded.
- No refunds will be issued for same-day departures. Please notify the front desk by 11:59pm the night before departure for refunds of future nights.
- Maximum Stay: 14 nights per 365-day period.
- Camping equipment, sleeping bags, and personal linens are not permitted in the dorms.
- The hostel is not responsible for lost or damaged items.
- Any violation of hostel policies may result in eviction from the property.
